These products contain high levels of sugar and caffeine. There have been studies that link energy drinks to sleep problems, mental health issues, childhood obesity, anddamage to children's teeth. Most energy drinks state that they are not suitable for children on the packaging and most supermarkets have a voluntary ban on the sale of energy drinks to under 16 year olds.




Bush Craft Module



A Parent's Guide to Cyberbullying










