

## PUPIL PREMIUM IMPACT STATEMENT : 2014 - 2015

The pupil premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years. This additional funding is given to schools so that they can support their disadvantaged pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. The government has determined that it is for schools to decide how the pupil premium is spent, in order that they might make appropriate additional provision for individual students. The Forest Education Centre draws this funding from referring schools.

In the academic year 2014 - 2015 The Forest Education Centre had 30 students in receipt of Pupil Premium funding.

As a result of interventions and additional support offered to those students, the following outcomes were achieved:
